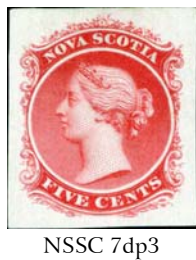

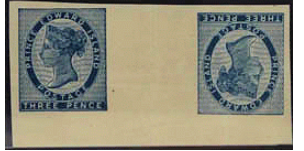

## Stamp Perforation Development in Canada

In 1851 sheets printed to contain individually imaged stamps were produced for and released by the Post Office without any mechanical means to separate one from another. A most time consuming work load for the Post Office staff. Often the resultant product from their attempts was damage to the image while being separated from the others. Post Office staff generally used scissors or any sharp blade device to effect separation.



In 1858 it seems that a new requirement must have been placed with the fulfilment of the stamp reorders. It was the requirement that the stamps be able to be separated without the use of cutting devices. This necessitated the weakening of the paper by the introduction of holes surrounding each image on the sheet. This method is known as perforating. The resulting holes are called perforations.

This perforator device consisted of wheels having a number of pins on them aligned along an upper shaft paired to wheels with the same number of holes on them aligned along a lower shaft. After finishing the initial perforating the stamp sheet was turned 90 degrees and the wheel ran across the sheet in that direction. The wheel pins



penetrated the firmly held paper. The quantity of pins and holes on this wheel were known. The quantity of holes over the passage of a set distance can be measured. Stamp collectors have used such a gauge that measures the quantity of distanced holes. It is called a perforation gauge which has been calibrated to count the number of holes in the conventionally stated distance of two centimetres.

The perforation gauge generally utilized is calibrated for wheel pins that were made in the metric manner. The wheels that were made in North America were not of metric measurement. The instruments made for use in the United States and Canada were in imperial length measurement of inches not millimetres. The metric instrument making manner is definitely not North American.

As the Canadian stamp requirements were still being printed in the United States, the reorder in 1858 went to the same printing company Rawdon, Wright, Hatch & Edson New York. This company had renamed itself as American Bank Note Co. New York (ABNCo). Over the passage of time other printing company names arose such as British American Bank Note Co. Ottawa (BABNCo) and won the Canadian printing contracts but all were from North America with the ABNCo parent company in the United States. The printing presses and perforation machines were manufactured in the United States utilizing imperial measurement. The line perforations were performed using imperial measurement line perforator machines until 1978 when this line perforation machinery was phased out.

In 1858 the perforated stamps were produced by a perforating wheeled instrument that had 189 pins in its circumference on a wheel having a diameter of 4.03125 inches. This instrument created a hole pattern giving 11.75 x 11.75 holes when calculated to the present day conventionally standard stamp measurement dimensions of two centimetres. During this time period the stamp quantity needs were not overly extravagant with the demand most readily accomplished using a single same sized perforation multi-wheeled machine.

In 1859 the Canadian Post Office placed an order that entailed mammoth demand requirements. The printing company ABNCo was in the United States. The order involved six different designs and denominations and had huge quantity printing demands. When the stamp perforations are measured, several different line perforation machines are noticed to have been pressed into service to accomplish all the perforation requirements. The wheel perforator pins were 189 and 192. The machines used made these known combinations:

Corrections made. *Canada's Pence Era The Pence Stamps and Canadian Mail 1851 - 1859* provided research done by Arfken, Leggett, Firby, Steinhart provide number of printing orders and quantities per printed order. This edition reports total quantities ordered by PO. Disposal by PO is not germane to quantities ordered.

The American Bank Note Co (ABNCo) archive sale by Christies Robson Lowe New York, USA, Thursday Sept. 13, 1990 of the Canada Pence and Decimal issues had stated quantities in the sold lots of imperforates and imperforates with **SPECIMEN.** on them. Those quantities are placed into this catalogue.

For the 2¢ Edward VII stamps, printing Plates 1 to 30 with the rough top/bottom oval were probably in an unhardened state so that printing Plates 1 and 2 and printing Plates 5 to 30 [14, p. 1; 15, p. 1255] were bent for the rotary press while the printing Plates 3 and 4 were flat plates and did not need to be bent [5, pp. 73-74]. Printing Plates 31 to 86 [14, p. 1; 15 p. 1255] with smooth top/bottom oval were probably in a hardened state and were bent for the rotary press first starting sometime around late 1905 [5, pp. 17, 25, 72, 74-77; 1, p. 33]. The dry printed stamps from 1905 from printing Plates 13, 14, 15 and 16 have rough top/bottom oval with a design width of 18-18.5 mm and a paper thickness of 0.0022"-0.0032" [5, p. 129]. The dry printed stamps from 1907 from printing Plates 31, 32, 33 and 34 have smooth top/bottom oval with a design width of 17.8-18 mm and a paper thickness of 0.0024"-0.0029" [5, p. 129].

There is the 1907 experimental dry printed imperforate on dry pregummed paper plate proof stamps having blue-black horizontal line from Plates 31 and 32 known as Scott/Unitrade 90v/ NSSC 77i, 77j [7, pp. 21-22; 8, p. 84] and the same stamps having gutters in between as Scott/Unitrade 90vi/NSSC 77k, 77l [7, pp. 20-21; 8, pp. 79, 81, 83]. The 1907 experimental wet printed imperforate gummed plate proof stamps with a red horizontal line from Plate 43 is listed as Scott/Unitrade 90iv/NSSC 77m [7, p. 23; 8, p. 84] and the same stamps having gutters in between as Scott/Unitrade 90vi/NSSC 77n [7, p. 23; 8, p. 83].

The Scott/Unitrade 90v/NSSC 77ae, 77af part sheets have written on their upper left margins "2nd Lot of Printing" which is referring to the 1907 second lot of experimental dry printing [7, pp. 20-21; 8, pp. 79, 81]. The Scott/Unitrade 90iv/NSSC 77ag part sheet has written on its upper left margin "Regular" which is referring to the usual regular wet printing [7, p. 23; 8, p. 83]. These were all first anonymously reported in 1965 which was fifty eight years after 1907 [16, pp. 118-120; 5, pp. 32, 129-130, 134].

Since the Goldberg and Walsh discovery article, which is attached to this issue, another researcher John De Ell in conjunction with Julian J. Goldberg have been doing intensive searching of the other denominations in this issue that were printed by the rotary press wet method. They wanted to find if the same situational problem was fixed by the initial discovery method. That method utilizes a different perforator to complete the job. And have they been diligent! Huge quantities of used stamps were searched. A few in 10.94 x 10.94 (generic 11 x 11) perforations have been found for these stamps. It seems that these perforations were done on the left-over (waste) paper from the start and the end of the printing run. This paper remnants was cut into individual sheets and then were perforated on the different sheet perforator machine. They are on thicker paper due to the start and end of the paper roll when it was being made. They are:

It is known for years that three pairs exist. Their present whereabouts are unknown to the authors. These had to have come from the rotary press continuous wet ungummed sheet *waste scrap* material. The paper grain weave is vertical.

Their present whereabouts were unknown to the authors. Then in September 2016 Eastern Auctions Limited showed the block of three to us. The front and back images (fig. 1-1, fig. 1-2, fig. 1-3) were sent complimentary from Yohann Tanguay. The Eastern Auctions firm

[www.easternauctions.com](http://www.easternauctions.com) was auctioning these items as Lot # 73 and Lot # 74 on October 28, 2016 from *The Baron Collection*.

From the images we could confirm that the paper grain was of a vertical weave.

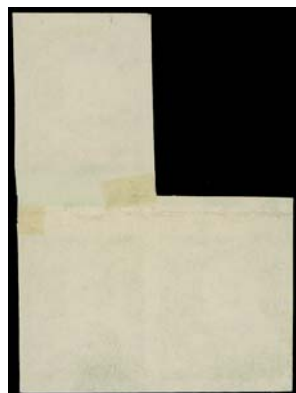

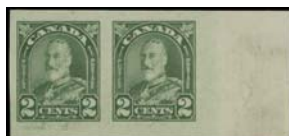

NSSC 139 g: pair

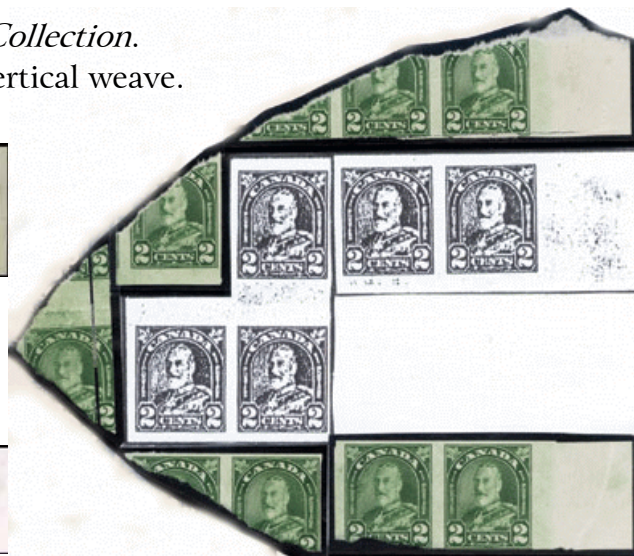

Lot # 74 (fig. 1-3) is the missing complement piece to the top right of fig. 1.

So from this information it can be seen that larger pieces of this *waste scrap* paper would have been salvaged. At this time in history, the 1930s, the era of the Great Depression, there was a call for saving not wasting. Realizing that processing this huge order was having printing problems to get filled, the pressmen took the undamaged stamped gummed imaged paper that would be considered suitable and trimmed it to the single sheet size and place them on to the single sheet-fed wheel perforators.

Even though this single sheet-fed perforator had a different perforation setting no great thought was given to there being such differences. Just get the total required contract quickly filled with the necessary printed stamp images would be the ethic.

Presented (figs.2-1; 2-2; 2-3; 2-4; 2-5) are the *discoveries* which prove what the pressmen had said happened, did occur. They are shown paired with different sheet stamps to enable perforation comparisons. The top stamps are 11 x 11 perforated and the bottom stamps are 11.25 x 11 perforated. The perforation hole size is shown to be larger on the 11 x 11 perforated top stamps. It can be demonstrated and is readily observed from these images that two different perforations exist. The 11.25 x 11 perforation had to come from the web-fed rotary press perforator while the printed sheet stamps from the rotary press that were perforated 11 x 11 had to come from the single sheet-fed perforator as it had different size wheel perforators.

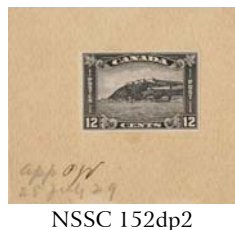

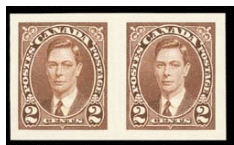

# 1942 - 43 War Issue

## Introduction

This research study is offered to *Walsh BNA Canada Specialized Stamp Catalogue*. It is from years of findings, particularly the plate blocks with focus on the imperforate issue formats. Catalogue numbers are as NSSC #s.

## Intent of the War Issue

“Why not commemorative stamp/s instead of a new general issue, similar to the Royal Visit Issue?” The Royal Visit commemorative stamps were issued on May 15, 1939 with a limited printing and were sold out in 1939. Mr. A.S. Deaville, supervisor of the Postage Stamp Division answered that with an article in ‘*Popular Stamps*’ published July 1942 (same month release date as the War Issue). Excerpts are from the first three paragraphs: *“Many people in Canada and elsewhere have felt that Canadian stamps should reflect more accurately the times in which we live,- that Canada’s material contribution to the cause of the Allied Nations and her vital importance as a great air training center, and food reservoir for beleaguered Britain, could be effectively advertised to the world through the medium of her postage stamp designs, which circulate in billions on the North and South American Continents, and throughout the British Commonwealth, ultimately penetrating to every corner of the globe.”*

*“Anyone who is acquainted with the philately of the Dominion will know that changes in Canadian postage stamp issues are not frequently or lightly made. Postmaster General Mulock had many considerations to ponder before deciding on a course of action. Hundreds of interested persons wrote to him, suggesting a special commemorative War issue of some kind. But such stamps have only a short life, and after their withdrawal, the Canadian people would have to return to the use of the old stamps, which were designed and issued some years before the outbreak of War. (eg: Mufti Issue of 1937). For publicity purposes a new general issue, designed to last ‘for the duration’ offered much greater advantages.”*

*“The Postmaster General decided upon a complete change in Canada’s regular postage stamps. Three recent photographs of His Majesty King George VI were specially flown from London. These portraits show him in Naval, Military and Royal Air Force uniforms, respectively, in service dress, as head of the British Armed Forces. Subjects illustrating Canada’s war effort on land, on sea and in the sky were carefully selected for the pictorial stamps. Some basic innovations in design were decided upon and the result is the series of stamps appearing this month.”*

The article continues with descriptions of each stamp. Two items found are, (fig.1) a photocopy of the original post office announcement poster of 1942. Item (fig.2) was described in auction as: ‘1 cent to 1 dollar War Issue complete set of photographic essays prepared by Canadian Bank Note Company and mounted on a special presentation card, a great rarity, VF Estimate value - \$1000.’

In his two booklet monogram researcher Julian J. Goldberg has provided to collectors of Canadian philately a wonderful insight into how some stamps of Canada were printed. He explains how. And then with images shows us the appearance of these stamps when they are printed by an American invented printing machine called *The Stickney Rotary Press*. The company in Canada that used this printing press is the British American Bank Note Company oft called BABNCo.

Julian's own book *Canadian Postage Stamps Printed by the Stickney Rotary Press* was released in 2012. His research findings are offer with great generosity to *Walsh British North America Specialized Stamp Catalogue* where his research complements the information found therein. His original research and findings are used with adjustments to fit NSSC format style. He originally utilized the Scott numbering system. These numbers have been changed to NSSC numbering system. # Canadian Postage Stamps Printed By The Stickney Rotary Press

from research by Julian J. Goldberg

The Stickney rotary press was invented by Benjamin R. Stickney who was an employee of the U.S. Government Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) in Washington, DC. There were two, small and large, sized rotary presses. The Stickney rotary press has

U. S. patent numbers 1,115,127 and 1,378,386.

The small press was used to print U.S. coil stamps while the large press was used to print U.S. sheet and booklet stamps. The Stickney rotary press

printed U.S. postage stamps from 1914 to 1962. Its U.S. first print of coil stamps was released on

June 30, 1914 followed by its first printing of regular sheet stamps released on May 26, 1920.

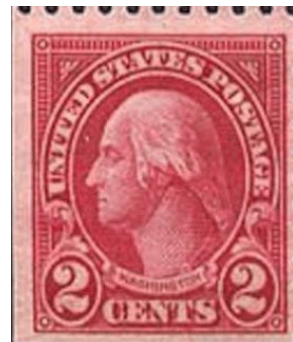
The first printing of its booklet stamps were released on August 27, 1926.

In 1930, the British American Bank Note Company (BABNCo) of Ottawa, Canada obtained a five year contract from the Canadian Government Finance Department to print Canadian postage stamps from 1930 to 1935 after the Canadian Bank Note Company (CBNCo) of Ottawa, Canada and the American Bank Note Company (ABNCo) of New York, NY had been printing Canadian postage stamps for over thirty years. The CBNCo, which was a subsidiary of the ABNCo, was a competitor of the BABNCo. The BEP supplied the BABNCo with printing and perforating equipment in the late 1920s and early 1930s.

Since the ABNCo was also a competitor of the BEP, a business connection developed between the BEP and the BABNCo. The BEP supplied the BABNCo with: a large Stickney rotary press to print sheet, booklet and coil stamps, a Stickney bar with a wheel perforator to perforate sheet and booklet stamps, a Stickney bar perforator to perforate coil stamps and a Stickney coiler to cut and wind coil stamps. Images are presented.



Large Stickney Rotary Press

The Stickney rotary press design allowed it to print large quantities of postage stamps in continuous paper web rolls faster than other printing presses. This rotary press was fed continuous web-fed rolls of un gummed paper that were later gummed by the same press. This rotary press initially printed stamps by wet printing. The web roll, of white wove stamp paper, had to be wetted first by the paper wetting roller unit on the press. Then this wet paper web roll was pressed by the impression roller against two rotating engraved curved steel printing plates mounted on the press printing unit. This enabled the moving wet paper web roll to absorb the inked printing plate impressions. Then the paper was dried by heaters to allow the printed paper roll to be gummed by the press gumming roller unit. After being gummed it was again dried and then rolled up before being perforated. An overprint or surcharge unit was located between the press printing unit and gumming unit for that eventuality. The Stickney rotary press as used by the BABNCo printed mostly large quantities of their lower denominated postage stamps. As the requirement for their higher denominated postage stamps was in small quantities, they used a flat plate printing press that printed stamps by dry printing. This flat plate press used one at a time single precut sheet-fed sheets of pre-gummed paper.
